Welcome to the Challengers Drive 2016

Enclosed you will find your route plan for the event. Please read the below information carefully so you have a safe and fun run with us today.

- You have been given an allocated set off time, please be ready to leave on time.
- As you are waiting to be set off, you will have the opportunity to have a picture taken in front of the Loseley Manor House we will send these to you after the event.
- Please read all route instructions carefully, we have tried to be as detailed as possible and noted all junctions and turns that you will need to take.
- The instructions are based on the "Tulip" Style road books. For those not familiar
 with this, the key thing to remember is the diagram shows the direction you are travelling in
- starting from the orange spot and leaving via the direction the arrow is pointing.
- For every instruction there is a diagram showing the direction you should travel in.
- The first column on the plan shows total miles, the second column miles between each instruction, the third a diagram of the instruction and lastly a small explanation about the instruction.
- * Just after the 42 mile mark, there is a toll bridge. You will need 60p to cross the toll and continue on the route.
- Distances are as close to 0.2 miles accuracy wherever possible.
- There are a number of places of interest along the route which we have noted on the instructions and put additional information in the back of this booklet. Please feel free to stop as you wish this is not a race!
- We have recommended you stop at Wellington Farm Shop for a refreshment break as this is approximately half way so will be a good opportunity to grab a drink or use the facilities.

- When you arrive you will be directed in to a reserved area for cars taking part in the drive.
- Please observe all speed limits and road traffic laws
- Please drive considerably at all times, particularly through the villages and be mindful of other road users.
- Please note there is NO technical, mechanical or breakdown service provided on this drive — you are responsible for your own vehicle.
- When registering for the event you signed to agree that you took responsibility for your motor vehicle, stating that it was road legal, suitably insured and in good order for the event.


Points of interest along the way...



Built in the reign of Elizabeth I, Loseley Park stands in ancient Surrey Parkland close to the North Downs. Still the home of the More-Molyneux family, it is remarkably unchanged since 1562 when Sir William More laid the first stones, and remains, as he intended, a place of calm, grace and subtle beauty.

Loseley Park - Start point

The Kennet and Avon Canal is a waterway in southern England with an overall length of 87 miles (140 km), made up of two lengths of navigable river linked by a canal. The name is commonly used to refer to the entire length of the navigation rather than solely to the central canal section. From Bristol to Bath the waterway follows the natural course of the River Avon before the canal links it to the River Kennet at Newbury, and from there to Reading on the River Thames. In all, the waterway incorporates 105 locks.




Kennet and Avon Canal

Wellington Farm Shop - Half way point

Wellington Farm Shop provides discerning rural residents a shopping experience synonymous with the fine food stores of London. Everyday essentials such as freshly-baked breads, cakes, eggs and milk may be found alongside specialised sauces, baking goods and store cupboard staples. Wellington Olive oil, pressed from the Arbequino variety, is produced on the family's Spanish estate. Honey extracted from hives at Stratfield Saye imparts a unique flavour of this lovely part of Hampshire.




An intimate family home and peaceful estate set in the rolling hills of the Chilterns.

This picturesque 16th-century mansion and tranquil gardens were home to the Brunner family until recent years. The house exudes a welcoming atmosphere with a well-stocked kitchen and homely living rooms. The series of walled gardens is a colourful patchwork of interest set amid medieval ruins.

Other buildings from earlier eras include the Great Tower from the 12th century and a rare Tudor donkey wheel, in use until the early 20th century.

Greys Court (National Trust)

Henley on Thames is one of the most beautiful towns in England, recently voted by The Times as one of the best places to live in the English countryside. Henley's riverside location, surrounded by a Chiltern landscape of wooded hills and green fields, lends itself to relaxation, long lunches and quirky shopping. There's a pub where Charles I drank, a Chantry house, a butcher that smokes his own meat and independent shops still offering the personal touch. It is also home to the world's greatest rowing regatta, The Henley Royal Regatta.


