

The **Beachy Head Vintage Inn,** Kieron and Chris and their team, have gone out of their way to open up a little earlier to accommodate our coffee stop, thanks guys, much appreciated. Whilst Kieron is out running the London Marathon, Chris and his team have come in  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour early to serve us from 10.30 am, so if there's a staff pot on the bar, let's be generous!

And Simon, at **The Lamb**, thanks Simon for your enthusiasm, it's great that you love cars so much AND run a great pub! It does help.

### An important point.

The event is NOT a race. In the event of an accident, you are responsible for insurance, and you will have signed a form to indemnify the club against your insurer passing on a claim to The Club.

We will be driving in country lanes, and speed limits must be adhered to. As a classic car driver you will be aware that other drivers have distractions, are insulated, and possibly unconscious of how fast they are going. They are not expecting to encounter a low, small, 50+ year old car coming towards them at short notice. So, as ever, be aware.

#### The Start:

From 7.30 am we are meeting at Sheffield Park, Bluebell Railway.

All arriving cars will park in car park "A" at the top of the drive on the left near the station.

#### On arrival we'll ask you to "sign on"

This will be an MSA (Motor Sports Association) form to indemnify our club in the event of an insurance claim.

We will take the opportunity to check who's taking part.

And you will be given this Roadbook with the route from the team.

**From 8.00 am** The cafe is open for hot breakfasts (including some vegetarian options) and coffee. Enjoy!

The Cafe, known as the "Bessemer Arms" is through the ticket office, turn left and approx. 50 metres along platform 1. The WC is in the Cafe.

It's worth noting that this is a "no charge" event, so you'll be paying your way at all stops.

**From 9.00 am** we will be starting cars, at 1 minute intervals, to as far as possible, avoid bunching. We hope the last car will be away by 9.30 am

Don't forget to zero your trip at the exit!!

#### **Coffee Break and Walk**

Our half way stop, The Beachy Head Vintage Inn, will be open from 10.30 am Many thanks and appreciation to Chris and his team who have come in  $\frac{1}{2}$  hour earlier than normal to accommodate us.

Take care to make a sharp left into to the lower car park, where you will find loads of room to park, and your friends.

Inside, Chris and his happy helpers will be serving coffee, muffins etc.

Across the road, less than 5 minutes away, is the Bomber Command WW2 Memorial which is not to be missed.

From the same promontory, there is a spectacular view of Beachy Head lighthouse. Take care in the excitement crossing the road, it's busier than you'd think. (We found out)

#### The second Stage: home to Lunch at The Lamb, Piltdown

Reset your trip for the second stage to The Lamb at Piltdown. Allow about 1 hour.

On arrival look out for the first or second parking bay reserved for our Healeys.

It's likely that the early starters will be arriving from about 12.30 a.m., assuming they spend an hour or so at Beachy Head.

Our host at The Lamb, Simon, has arranged for the Sunday Lunch Menu to be orderable up till 2.00pm

#### **Origins of Drive It Day**



Drive It Day is inspired by the FBHVC, and the FBHVC sets the date each year. The FBHVC is The Federation of British Historic Vehicle Clubs. The officers are volunteers. They do a brilliant job representing our clubs. In their spare time they are experts in creating tongue twisting unmemorable acronyms such as FBHVC.

They represent 540 Clubs such as ours, representing an amazing 250,000 persons including our trade organisations.

Nearly everyone has heard of the London to Brighton run, first run in 1896, which celebrates the abolition of the red flag rule and 4 mph speed limit.

But how many have heard of the far more demanding 1,000 mile run? It was held in 1900, only 4 years later, running from 23rd April to 12th May. Starting at Hyde Park Corner, London, the entrants drove to Bath, Bristol, Gloucester, Worcester, Birmingham, Derby, Matlock, Buxton, Manchester, Preston, Kendal, Keswick, Carlisle, Peebles, Edinburgh, Dunmail Rise, Berwick, Newcastle, Durham, York, Leeds, Harrogate, Bradford, Sheffield, Wellbeck Park, Lincoln, Nottingham, Leicester, Northampton, St Albans, and back to Marble Arch, London.

Sorry about the long list, it's more of a tribute than a list.

Incredibly, the participants found time to tackle 4 Hill climb events, including Shap Fell, 7.5 miles, and, very important, by all accounts still found time to party, big time.

There were 83 entries. 65 started, and 35 finished. Incredible.



It's this brave event and achievement that Drive It Day commemorates. The aim is to encourage as many Classic, Vintage and Veteran cars out on the road, UK wide, as possible on the same day. It demonstrates just how many we are, and the huge variety of our cars, and, hopefully, generates public awareness, interest, and support in veteran, vintage, and classic cars.

Our cars support an annual £5.5 billion industry (FBHVC 2016) which provides direct employment to 34,900 persons and earns valuable foreign exchange. In particular the Federation is keen to develop Young Person's Apprenticeships. Our Classics can offer unique and accessible opportunities for young people seeking a skilled career.

With changes in fuel formulation, electric cars here, driverless cars on the horizon, and ultra low emission zones now happening, the Federation does a great job in ensuring that while we are part of progress to clean up our environment, (good) we can still drive historic cars for everyone's interest and pleasure.

#### The Roadbook

It's called a Tulip Roadbook because it was first used in the Dutch Tulip Rally which first ran in 1949. It still runs each year and was won by a Healey Frogeye in 2015, 2012, and 2009 driven by Rinus Rinke, with Bart den Hartog Navigating.

This version of Tulip Roadbook is from Don Barrow, who navigated with Timo Makinen in a Works Healey 3000 in the '60s

#### If you haven't used a Tulip Roadbook before:

## On our Tulip Drawings, you always enter from the base of the drawing.

#### The arrow depicts the exit to be taken

Tulip Roadbooks often have a black ball showing the entry point, but this is not shown on ours.

FP = Finger Post
MS = Metal Sign
RAB = Roundabout

Red = Important
Black = Instruction
Green = Information

Generally we do not show junctions where you go straight on.

#### Miles:

Shown from one Way Point to another, and the cumulative total for each leg.

Car trip meters are notoriously inaccurate so the mileages and decimal points are indicative only.

Navigators, beware of .1 -It may have just clicked or be about to click!
