May 1985: Bob Beaumont was Clerk of the Course at a Grass Auto-Test Southern Counties ran in conjunction with three other clubs at the Bentley Wildfowl Trust. There were 5 classes up to 1,300 CC, i.e. Sprites only, with our <u>Vice President's Cup</u> going to the best Southern Counties member driving an Austin Healey that day. Two attempts, no practicing beforehand, best time to count. Limited Slip Diff allowed but subject a 10% penalty. Bob's wife was Secretary of the Course; Kevin Law was Chief Scrutineer and Ken Jarrett Chief Timekeeper. As a footnote, I can report that our current Committee has plans to re-purposed this cup as an award to someone the Chairman (that's me!) thinks has done something exceptional during the year. I apologise in advance if this re-purposing causes any offence.

May 1995: Southern Counties was doing a 'membership drive' by way of a competition. All members were provided with cards to place under the windscreen wiper of any Healey cars they saw that did not display a membership badge, inviting the owner to join the Club. The

membership application cards were marked with the Membership Number of the person posting the card and the Member successfully gaining the greatest number of sign-ups received the prize. I think our Committee should give consideration to resurrecting this, or a

similar, idea.

June 2005: Our then Secretary, George Smith, had just visited the Healey Drivers' Club Dawlish

50th Anniversary Meeting and won the prize for Best non-convertible 3000. There were plans for a pub lunch at the Ravenswood hotel, Sharpthorne, a charity run from Brooklands via Leonardslee to Herstmonceaux in aid of the 'Hospice in the Weald', Wings 'n Things at

Tenterden, a croquet day and a planned drive in October.

June 2015: There was a report on the Spring lunch at the George and Dragon at Houghton, an

advert for the Summer BBQ hosted by Piers and Anne De Legh at Crawley Down (these days

the Summer Picnic at Jeff Snell's residence, just down the road), and a report on an early May Bank Holiday trip to a very stormy Guernsey (participants were warned to take an early ferry

home, or wait for the storm to pass). At that time, there were just three Noggin venues: The

Woodman near Goathurst in Kent, The Jolly Farmers at Betchworth in Surrey, and The Lamb

at Piltdown in East Sussex. Currently we have six.

As always, there is a lot going on but, it's down to you to make sure it happens. Please,

organise your own LOCAL events, share them with LOCAL Members and get out there and "get

driving". If you would like any help, guidance or assistance in connecting with people, please

let me, or any other member of our Committee, know and we will do our best to help you.
